Appendix I

Service Category Data Dictionary

This data dictionary includes services that might be included in a given service category. This listing is in no way exhaustive and should be used as a guide for selecting a category to which a specific service belongs.

1. **AT Aftercare/Transitional Services**

Services that are provided to a child or youth who has been in a more restrictive setting that follow him/her as he/she moves to a lesser restrictive setting in the community.

- Transition Services
- Discharge Planning
- Training/Consultation from Residential Program to Community

2. **CM Case Management/Service Coordination Services**

A service with the primary function of managing a case or coordinating the services of an individual.

3. **CS Customized Services**

Any service that does not currently exist but the provider will specifically design for an individual child, youth or family at the purchasers request.

4. **CT Counseling/Therapy/Mental Health Services**

Services related to the professional guidance or treatment of the psychological needs of the youth or child.

5. **DA Day Service**

Alternative or supportive day programs for children and youth living in the community.

- In child's own home, family home setting or centers for specialized populations

- Instructional/Recreational Programs During School Breaks

6. **DS-Diagnostic Services**

Services available for evaluation and diagnostic purposes.

- Psychological Evaluations and Testing
- Educational Evaluation and Testing
- Occupational, Physical, Speech and Language Evaluations
- Vocational Testing
- Substance Abuse Evaluations
- Audiological Screening and Evaluations
- Visual Screening and Evaluations
- Medical Diagnostic Procedures

7. **ED Educational Services**
All programs designed to educate children and youth under the age of 22.
- Special Education Programs
 - Alternative Education
 - Vocational Training
 - Community-Based Vocational Training
 - On-Site Residential School Programs
 - Public School Integration
 - Day Schools
8. **EI Early Intervention/Prevention Services**
Programs and services available to youth and their families when the child is young, when a problem is first identified or to prevent family deterioration.
- Parenting Classes, Training, Support Groups
 - Health and Medical Prevention and Wilderness Programs
 - Educational Programs
 - Community Intervention Programs
9. **ES Emergency Services**
Programs and support that are available 24 hours/day, 365 days/year that can be accessed immediately.
- Emergency Shelter/Placements
 - Crisis Stabilization (In or Out of Home)
 - Pre-Screening for Mental Health Commitments
 - Emergency Mental Health Assessments
10. **HE Home-Based Services**
Services provided to maintain the youth or child within his/her family and community. - Services
- In Home
 - Behavioral Intervention Programs
 - Intensive Probation
 - One on One Services
11. **IL Independent Living Services**
Any service designed to assist a youth as they transition from their youth into adulthood that enables them to function independently.
- Life Skills Training/Counseling
 - Supervised Living
 - Career/Vocational Counseling
 - Mentor Programs
 - Employment Related Services
12. **MC Multicultural Services**
Any service or program that is available to youth and families in their native language or has been developed with knowledge of their cultural heritage.
13. **MS Medical Services**
Any program or service that has to do with the physical well-being or treatment of organic disorders/diseases of the body.
- Community-Based
 - In-Home/Nursing Services
 - In-Home Medical Training and Support Services
 - Medical Equipment and Supplies Residential Based
 - Psychiatric Services
 - Medical testing
 - Equipment on Site
 - Doctors/Nurses on Site Residential and/or Community Based

 - Vaccinations/Immunizations
 - Pre-Natal Examinations
 - Diagnostic Procedures
 - Audiological Services

- Ophthalmologic Services
 - Orthopedic Services
 - Respiratory Therapy
14. **RE Residential Services**
Any public or private facility where 24 hour. Supervised care is provided to a child or youth who is separated from his/her legal guardians.
- Community-Based Residential Programs (Group Homes, Supervised Apartments, etc.)
 - Campus-Based Residential Programs
15. **RH Rehabilitative Services**
Any program or service that works to restore or bring to a condition of health or useful and constructive activity.
- Cognitive Retraining (Traumatic Brain Injury)
 - Aural Rehabilitation (Hearing)
 - Physical and Occupational Therapies
 - Speech and Language Therapy
16. **RS Respite Care Services**
Any service or program which gives the legal guardian temporary relief from the responsibility of direct care.
- Day, Overnight, Weekend, Weeks
 - In-Home or Out of Home
17. **SA Substance Abuse Services**
Services and programs that address youth and family issues in the abuse of legal and illegal substances.
- Evaluations, Testing, Screening
 - Education
 - Groups
 - In-Patient/Out-Patient
 - Aftercare/Transitional
18. **SF Specialized/Therapeutic Foster Care Services**
The services included in the placement of youths in family settings that are not their own. The foster families are trained specifically to work with children who present a variety of disabilities and emotional needs.
19. **TC Therapeutic Camp/Recreation/Socialization Programs**
Services and programs that offer normalizing experiences and activities for youth and children who have disabilities and emotional needs.
- Summer, Holiday Camps
 - Day Camps
 - Overnight Camps
 - Specialized/Adaptive Recreational Programs
20. **TP Teen Parent Services**
Services or programs available to youth and teens who are parents or who are pregnant. - Child Care While in School or Work Programs
- Pre-Natal, Medical Intervention
 - Pregnancy Counseling
 - Education on Parenting. Obtaining Child Care
 - Placements/Shelter for Teens and their Children
21. **TR Transportation**
Any service that provides the youth or family with the ability to travel to and from a needed destination.
22. **WI Wilderness**
A program which utilizes the natural environment to assist the youth in making changes.
