It's time to do a CANS Reassessment for a child on your caseload. You access the CANVaS website, enter the child's last name and SSN and get the message "No child found," or you see the message "This number is already attached to a child



in CANVaS 2.0." You know the child has a CANVaS account because you have a copy of the last CANS assessment, and yes, you know this number is in use because it's THIS CHILD'S NUMBER! Why can't you find him? <u>Read more...</u>
