System of Care



A system of care is: A spectrum of effective, community-based services and supports for children and youth with or at risk for mental health or other challenges and their families, that is organized into a coordinated network, builds meaningful partnerships with families and youth, and addresses their cultural and linguistic needs, in order to help them to function better at home, in school, in the community, and throughout life. (Stroul, B., Blau, G., & Friedman, R., 2010)

- Home and community based
- Strengths based and individualized
- Culturally and linguistically competent
- Coordinated across systems and services
- Connected to natural helping networks
- Data driven and outcome oriented

Wraparound



Wraparound is defined by the National Wraparound Initiative as:

...an individualized, team-based service planning and care coordination process underpinned by a strong value base intended to improve outcomes for youth with complex behavioral health challenges and their families (Bruns et al., 2010).

Grant Background



DBHDS Awarded SAMHSA SOC Four Year Implementation Grant October 1, 2012-September 30, 2016

Components of the grant funded project include:

- Establishment of the Wraparound Center of Excellence at the Office of Comprehensive Services to increase capacity for Intensive Care Coordination Services
- Family/Youth Engagement & Training through the Virginia Family Network of NAMI
- DBHDS contracting with 5 community entities for service development that supports Intensive Care Coordination and the Wraparound philosophy at the individual service planning level and Systems of Care values and principles at the larger community level
