What are the UR/UM Requirements?

The Code of Virginia (COV) states that “each locality receiving funds for activities under the Comprehensive Services Act (CSA) shall have a locally determined utilization management plan...” (COV 2.2-2648)

The Community and Policy Management Team is charged with...developing and implementing the local Utilization Management Plan (COV 2.2-5206)



Requirements Continued

The Family Assessment and Planning Team or approved alternative multidisciplinary team, in collaboration with the family, shall provide regular monitoring and utilization review of the services and residential placement for the child to determine whether services and placement continue to provide the most appropriate and effective services for the child and his family. (COV 2.2-5208)”

What is Utilization Review (UR)?

UR is the process of evaluating the appropriateness and effectiveness of services.





Utilization Review

- NOT a means of cutting necessary services
- NOT a series of paper exercises or box checking that does not improve care
- NOT a pathway to second guessing the case manager, service provider, or FAPT

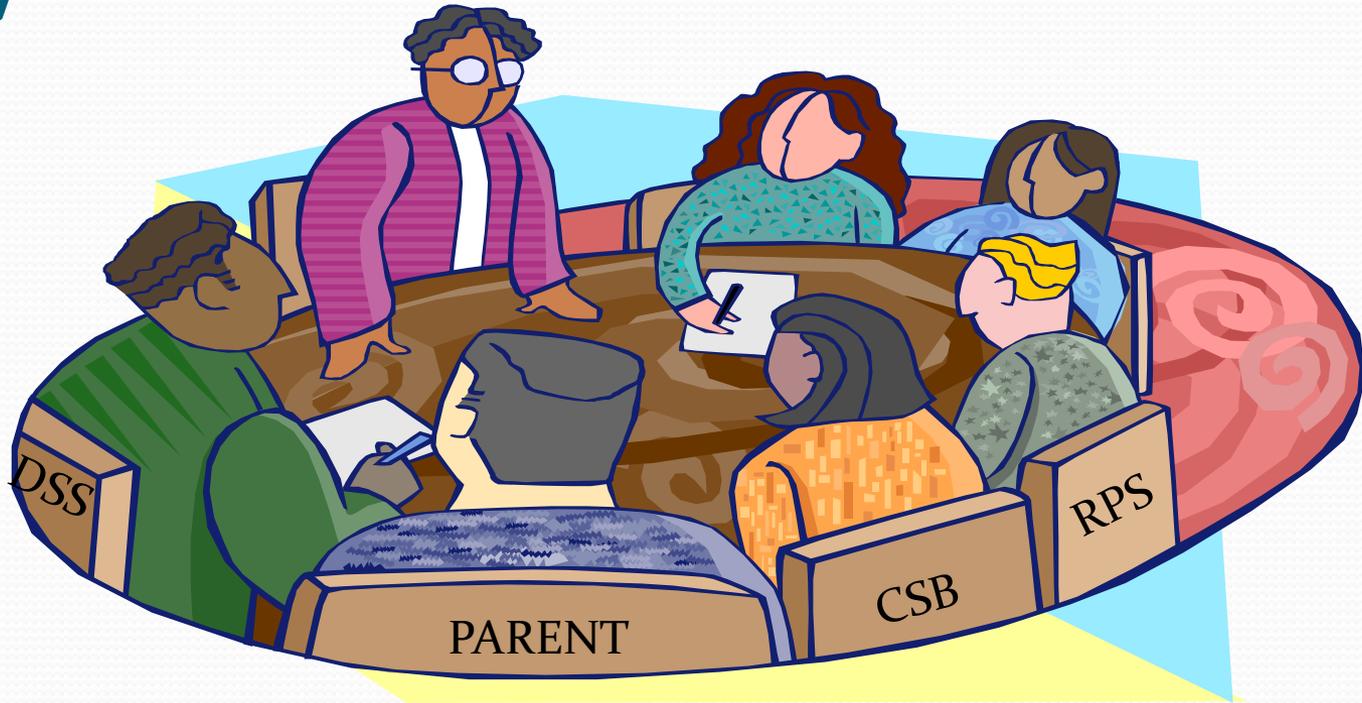

FAPT Team and Case Managers

- Review cases every 3 months
- Youth, families, providers, case managers and providers present
- CANS is used to develop the IFSP
- Harmony used to capture minutes, IFSP, funding recommendations
- All providers must follow a specific reporting format
- All parties provided with comment cards
- Providers are evaluated at FAPT

Utilization Review Begins With:

- CSA Coordinator
- Case Managers
- FAPT
- FAPT Coordinator
- Contract and Medicaid Administrative Support
- Utilization Review Manager



Richmond's UR Practices

UR Manager uses customized **review forms** compiled from:

- ✓ Licensing (DMAS and DBHDS)
- ✓ Regulation of Children's Residential Facilities
- ✓ State Board of Social Services Standards for Child-Placing Agencies (DSS)



Types of Providers Reviewed

- ✓ Treatment Foster Care (Specific TFC homes included)
- ✓ Independent Living Programs
- ✓ Group Homes
- ✓ Residential Treatment Facilities
- ✓ Community Based Service Providers



On-Site Utilization Review Practices

- Program Review utilizing a Service- Specific audit tool
- Interview youth, case manager, and therapist
- Exit Interview
- Written report of findings sent to service provider:
 - Strengths,
 - Recommendations,
 - Corrective Action Plan (if necessary)

Utilization Review- Where to Start?

- ✓ Are the services appropriate and efficient?
- ✓ Are goals specific to the needs of the youth?
- ✓ Is the family actively involved in treatment planning and service provisions?
- ✓ Is the youth making progress towards completing goals?
- ✓ If the youth is not making progress, what changes need to be made?



More UR Questions to Ask

- ✓ Is the discharge plan realistic? Not based on program length.
- ✓ Does the discharge plan match the FAPT/Court approved plan?
- ✓ What is the step down plan?

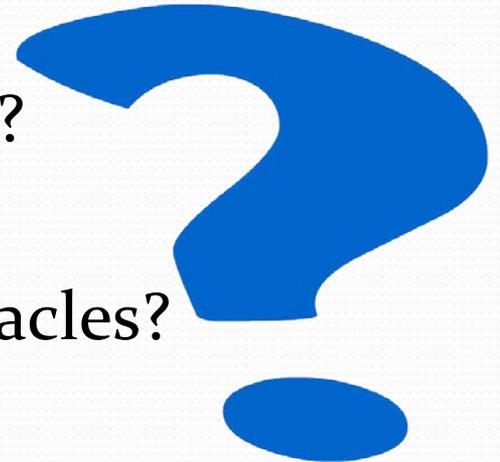

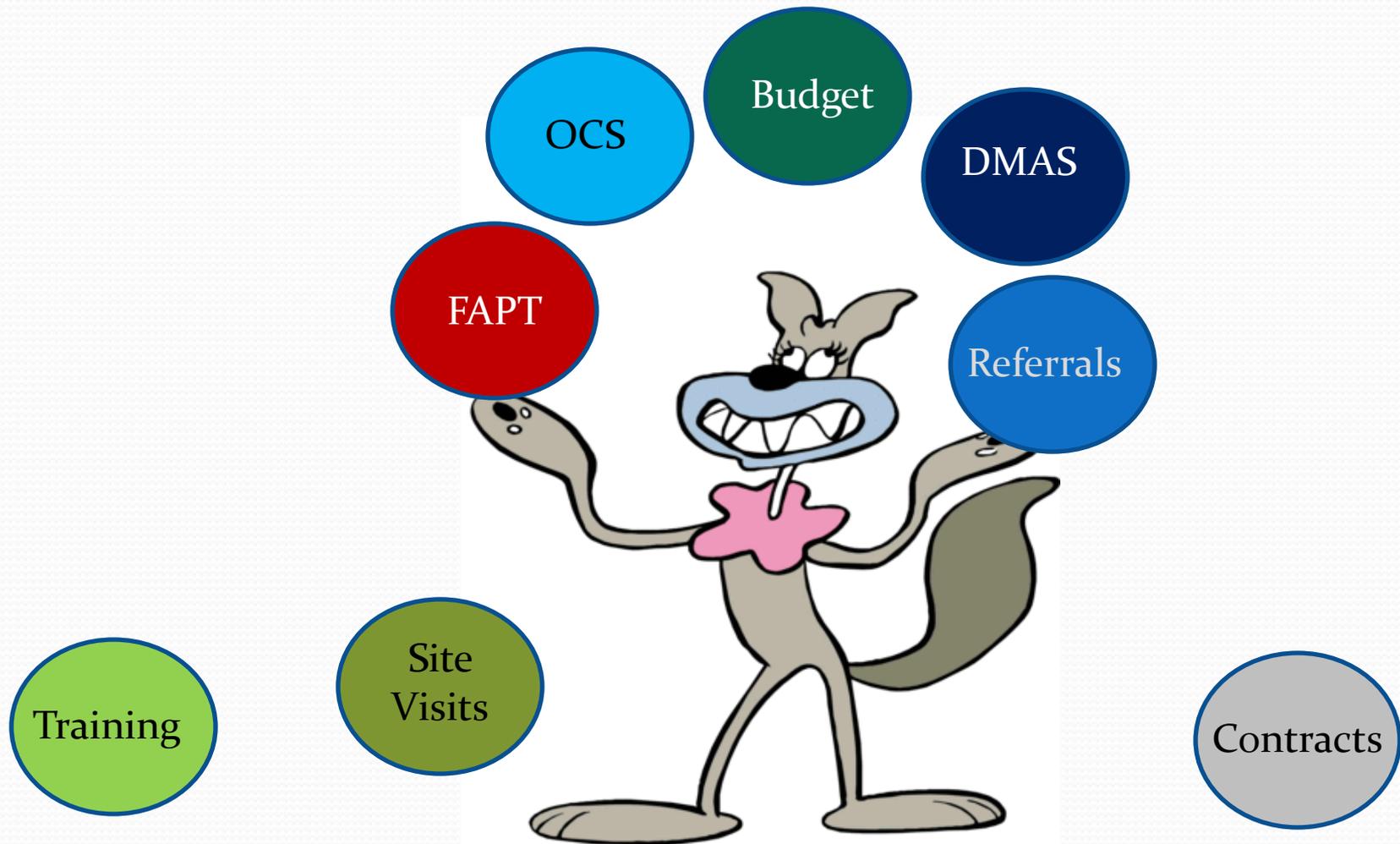
What specific strategies are used to encourage progress?

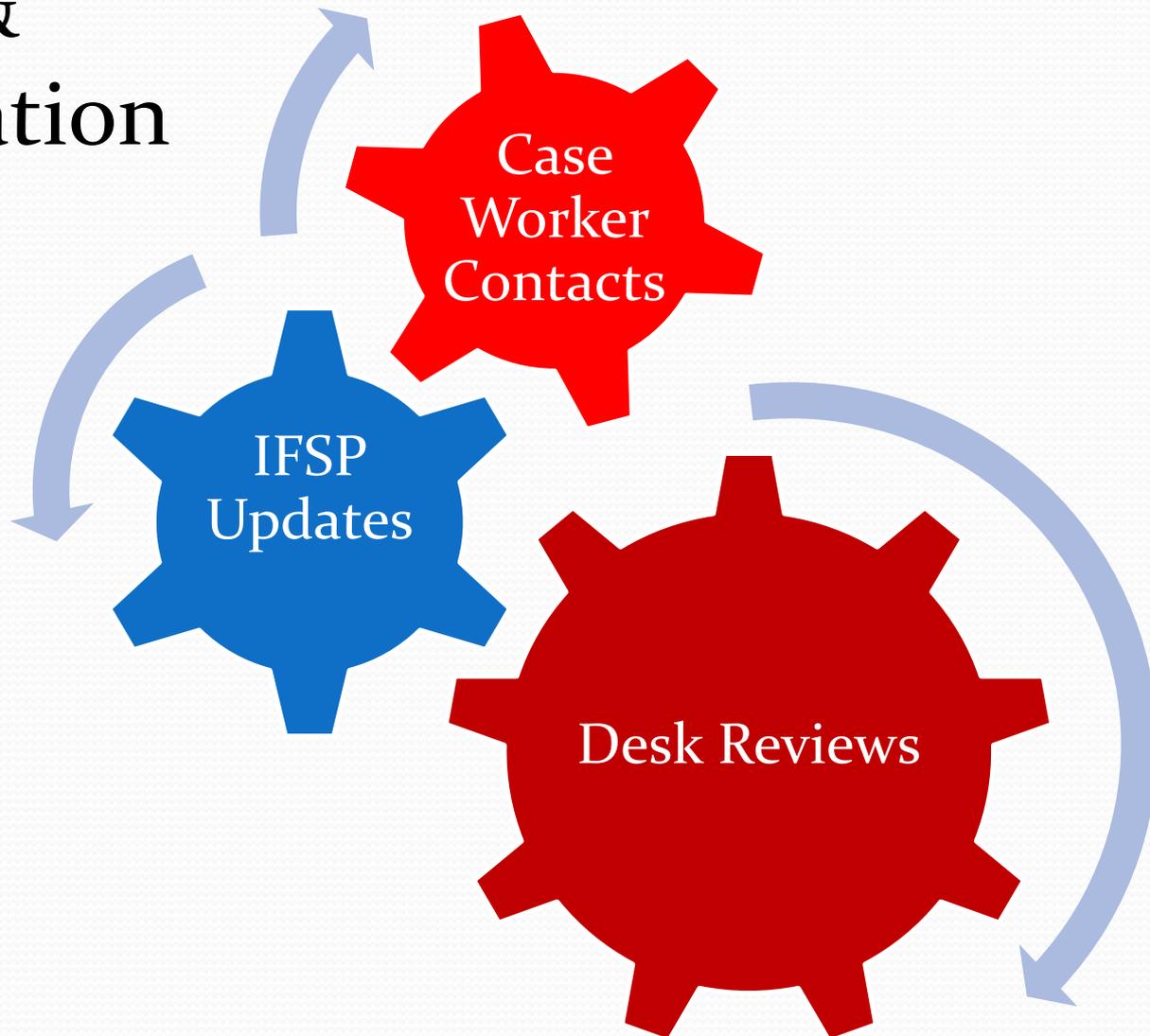

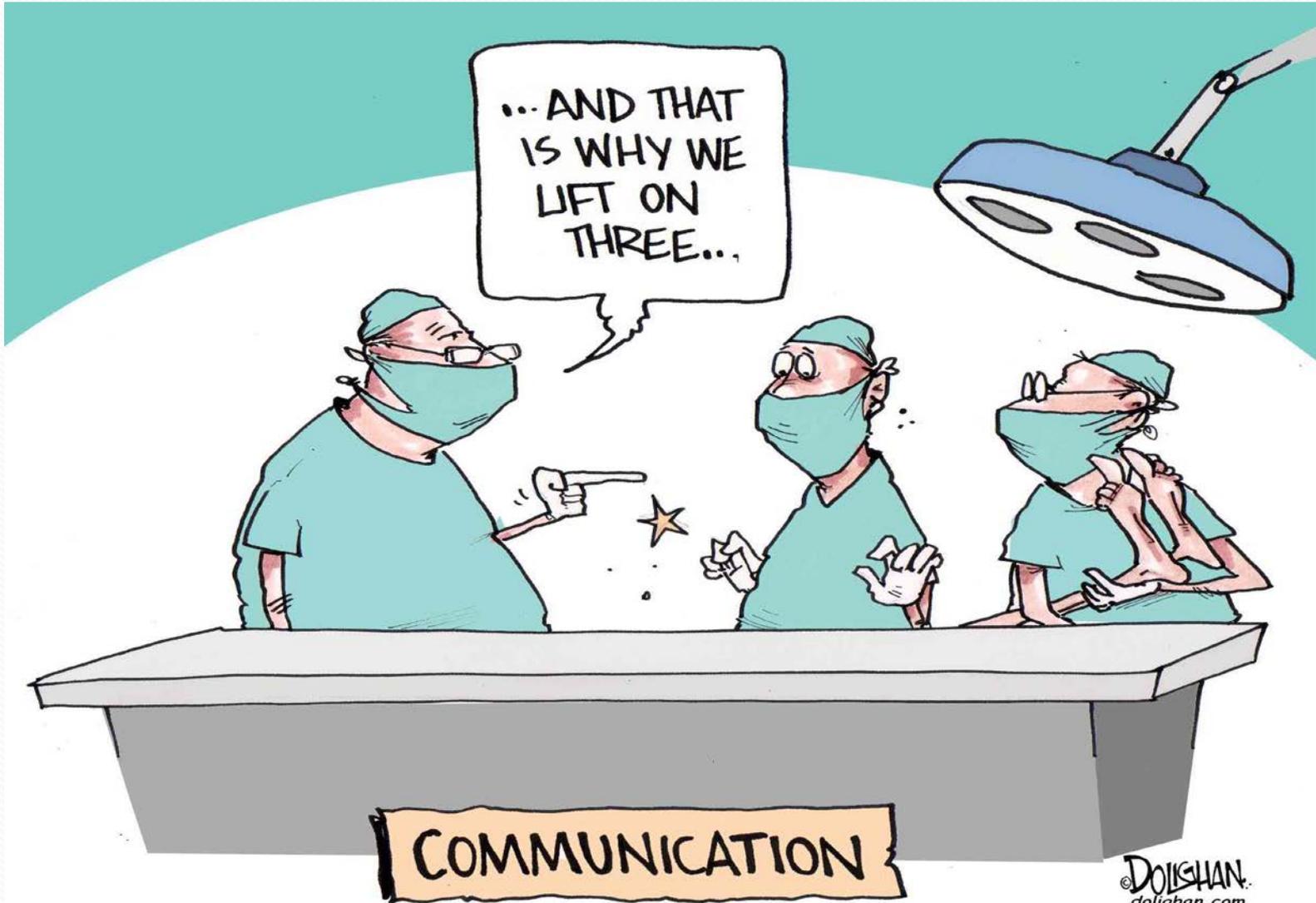
- Frontline UR process

FAPT

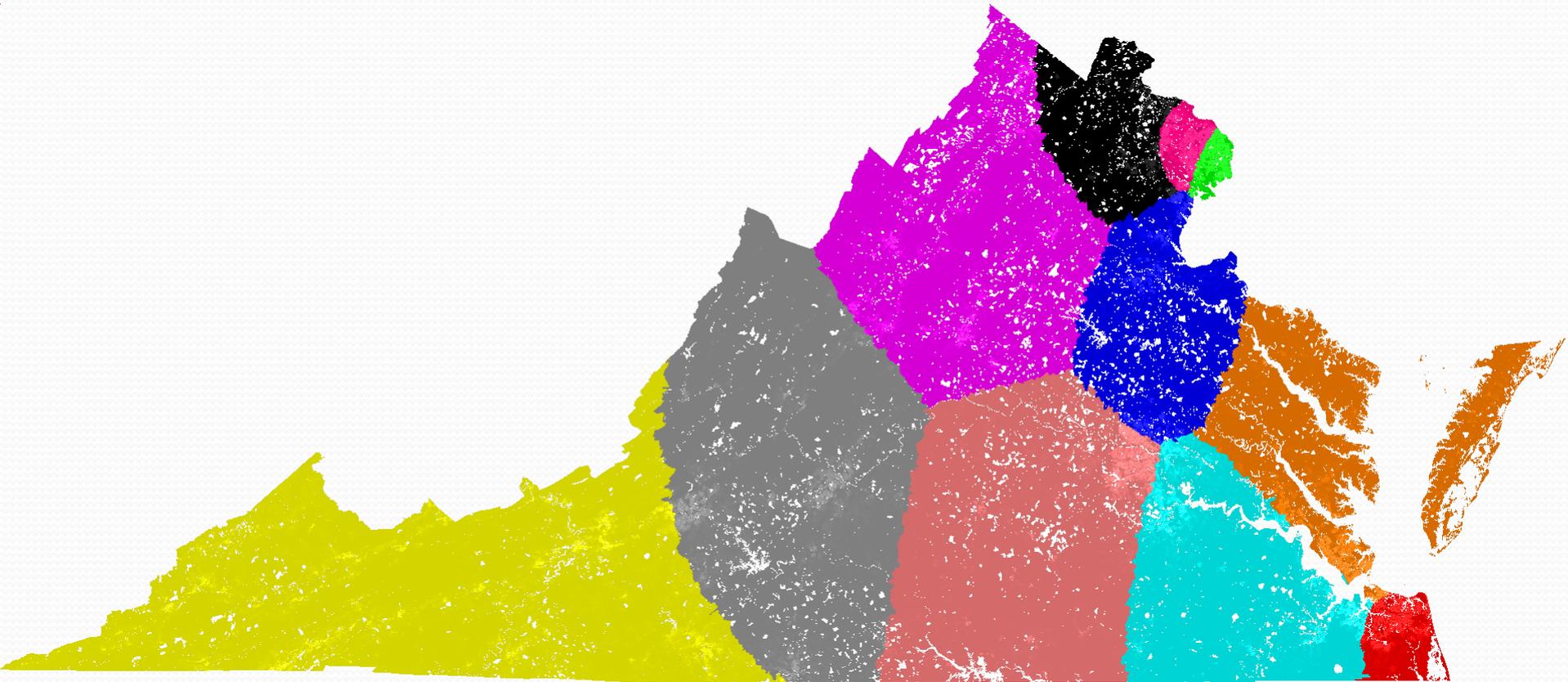
- Schedules maximize caseworker efficiency.

State Sponsored Utilization Review

- **FREE** to localities who enter into an agreement with OCS (currently 18 localities served)
- Completed on all CSA children in a residential facility for mental health/behavioral reasons
- Initial Desk Review completed 60 days after placement
- Subsequent Desk Reviews completed every 90 days
- Offers a neutral, third party, “birds eye” perspective

State Sponsored Utilization Review

- Provides a comprehensive review of all elements of youth's care (IFSP, CANS, Service Providers) with focus on System of Care
- Looks for evidence that all components of youth's plan of care are coordinated, incorporate youth and family voice, and match with the strengths and needs of the youth and family

State Sponsored Utilization Review

- Case information is submitted by CSA Coordinator or CSA Office
- Completed reviews sent to the CSA Coordinator and CPMT Chair
- Offers feedback, recommendations, and questions intended to facilitate dialogue and a critical review at the local level
- Monitors for implementation/consideration of these recommendations

Information Submitted for 60 day Initial Review:

- FAPT documentation that addresses the placement (FAPT minutes, case documentation submitted to CPMT, FAPT Referral Form)
- Most recent IFSP
- Most recent Foster Care Plan (if applicable)
- Information about prior placements (if applicable)
- Psychotropic Medication information
- Most recent Magellan (Medicaid) authorization/UM form (if applicable)
- Service Plan/Treatment Plan and progress reports from placement
- Psychological (if available)
- Discharge Plan
- Most recent CANS assessment

Information Submitted for 90 day Subsequent Reviews:

- FAPT documentation that addresses the placement (FAPT minutes, case documentation submitted to CPMT, FAPT Referral Form)
- Most recent CANS assessment
- Most recent IFSP
- Most recent Foster Care Plan (if applicable)
- Psychotropic Medication information
- Most recent Magellan (Medicaid) authorization/UM form (if applicable)
- Treatment Plan and progress reports from placement
- Discharge Plan
- Changes and/or actions in the Service Plan/IFSP in response to most recent UR

State Sponsored UR Asks:

- Are the services an appropriate match to the strengths and needs of the youth and family?
- What documentation supports the need for the services?
- Is the service being delivered as indicated in service agreement?
- Are the youth and family participating in the services?

State Sponsored UR Asks:

- Are the youth and family progressing towards identified goals in treatment plan? How do you know? (How is progress measured?)
- Is there a clear discharge plan?
- What work is occurring to achieve the discharge plan?

State Sponsored UR Asks:

- Does the current CANS match the clinical, behavioral, and social presentation of the youth and family?
- Does the IFSP incorporate the strengths and needs of the family? Are the strengths and needs guiding the services and goals?
- Are the IFSP goals measurable?
- Is the family and youth voice/participation reflected in the IFSP?





Lessons Learned

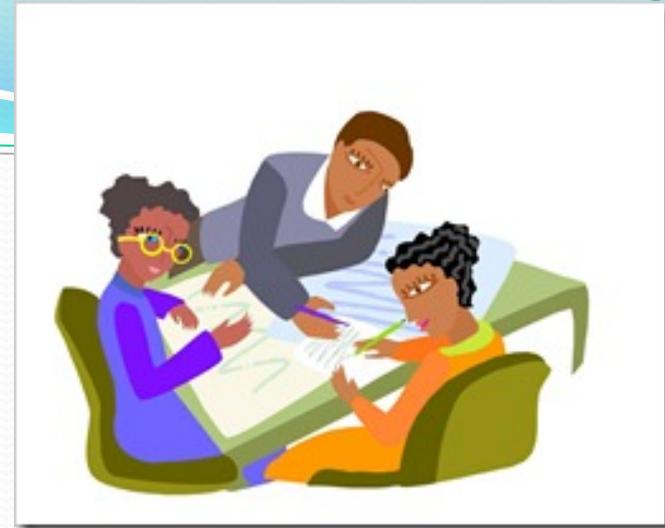
Develop UR Framework:

- What are your locality's priorities?
- What does your locality want to get out of your UR process?
- What is realistic for your locality?
- What can your locality do to achieve this?



Lessons Learned

Service Planning:



- Use data to develop the Service Plan
CANS, VEMAT, Court Plan, Medicaid Authorization,
Clinical Evaluations

Are These Congruent????

- Incorporate the youth and family voice
- Utilize strengths to develop the Service Plan

Lessons Learned

Providers:

- Know services the provider is delivering
- Goals and objectives: Measurable? Child specific? Changing?
- Reports: Progress? Measurable? Barriers?
- Understand what model guides their work
- Discharge plan?
- UR is not a licensure process



Lessons Learned

Site Visits:

- Physical Plant
- Treatment Services
- Is the provider doing what they say they are?
- Documentation
- Licensure Reviews
- Interviews: Youth, Staff, and Therapist



Lessons Learned

Professional Collaboration:



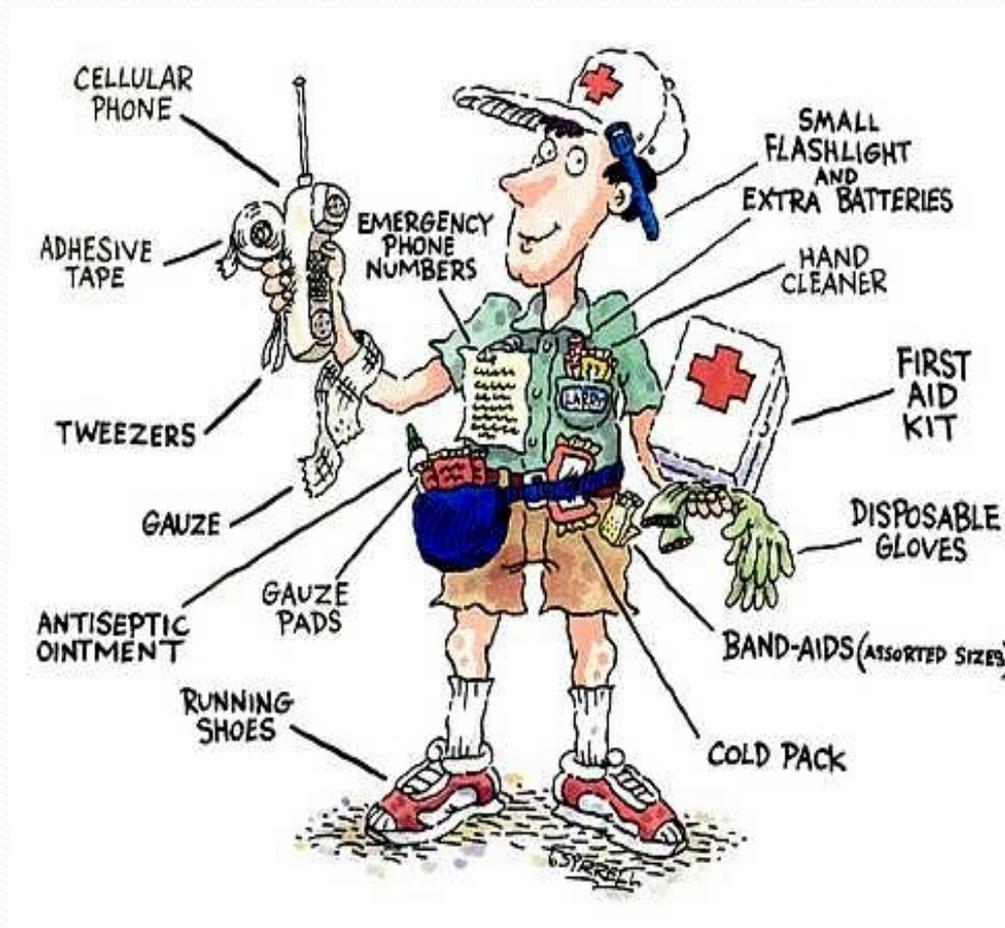
- Work closely with CSA Case Managers to develop and review services
- Utilize local and state partners to plan and problem solve
- Develop open communication with providers and CSA Case Managers
- Ask questions! Don't feel intimidated

This means each UR plan is unique... Your UR Plan needs to fit the individual strengths, needs, and abilities of your locality

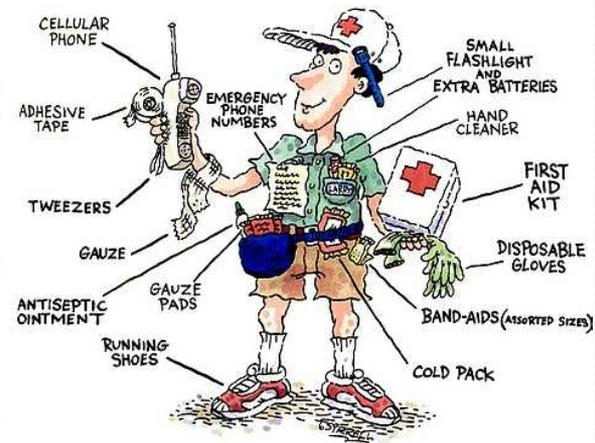
